


U.S. Quarterly GDP



*April estimate of Real GDP Percent Change from Q1 Year Ago, SA **If Q1 changes were annualized over the year.




MSA Real GMP









Colorado Springs MSA GMP by Sector









El Paso County & U.S. Age Groups












Hotel Occupancy Rate



Monthly Sales & Use Tax Collection






U.S. Vehicle Sales
